





CRIME, WELFARE, POLLUTION, HOUSING, TRANSPORTATION, TAXES, EDUCATION: NEW YORK CITY IS STRANGLING. MAILER AND BRESLIN ARE THE ONLY CANDIDATES OFFERING A PROGRAM THAT LEADS TO SOLUTIONS FOR THESE PROBLEMS.

TAXES

Each year the New York City taxpayer pays \$14 billion to the state and federal governments, and gets only \$3 billion back. The creation of a City-State would help to correct this imbalance and bring at least \$2 billion in additional revenue to the city.

TRANSPORTATION

All private cars will be banned in Manhattan. The number of cabs will be increased. All city bus and subway transportation will be free. A monorail will be built around the City-State. Publicly owned bicycles will be available to all without cost.

POLLUTION

The elimination of private cars in Manhattan will reduce pollution there by three-fifths. All vehicles and incinerators in the city will be required to have pollution control devices. Sweet Sunday will give the city breathing room once a month.

EDUCATION

The neighborhoods will have complete control over their school systems. The education of our children is not a political football—it must be left to the parents and students themselves.

HOUSING

Immediate rent control will be extended to all dwellings with two or more families. Neighborhoods will manage all rent control housing programs. The City-State will fund programs for rehabilitation, not demolition, and home-ownership for tenants.

CRIME

Local neighborhoods best understand how to control crime in their communities with policemen who have the respect of the community because they live there. The City-State will fund neighborhoods to administer their own crime control programs.

WELFARE

All welfare programs will be administered by the neighborhoods, eliminating most of the 15% of money spent for welfare case investigations. The City-State will fund neighborhoods to employ residents in local day-care centers, housing rehabilitation, on-the-job training, and recreational programs.

















